- Estimate 4000 PostDocs have no access to health benefits. CAPS-ACPS National Health Plan from \$55/month. Can provide coverage for some pre-existing conditions.
- CAPS/ACSP Home and Auto Insurance for contributing members
 - Co-operators Insurance Group: Home and Auto Insurance for PostDocs through CAPS/ACSP. Up to 40% discount. Other perks include hotel discounts.
- Group Discussion: Reimagining the Postdoctoral Training System
 - Estimates indicate that PostDocs lose ~\$90K in forgone income over a 3 year PostDoc appointment.
 - Common barriers to PostDoc recruitment are issues like stipend disparity and lack of benefits.
 - Lack of data metrics for tracking PostDoc labour conditions and labour marker outcomes (among many other things) impact everyone's ability to address PostDoc issues.
 - CAPS > National Post Doc Registry
 - Track PostDocs and their career in Canada.
 - Recommendation #1: Monitoring Training Outcomes
 - Data collection. How PostDocs are paid impacts ways data can be collected (also a PostDocs access to benefits, etc). Who should collect the data? What should be collected? What should be done with the data?
 - Some harmonization is occuring with the Tri-council. Consistency will allow better aggregation of data.
 - Recommendation #2: Establishing minimum standards for PostDoc support.
 - Recommendation #3: All PostDoc Scholars working in Canada should be classed as employees.
 - Recommendation #4: Establish a uniform National Policy on PostDoc Training.
 - Beyond the Professoriate Personal Tools for PostDoc Career Development
 - Beyond the Professoriate (BTP) hosts an online community/career hub for PhDs, offers webinars, virtual office hours, video library, curated resources, peer mentoring, courses and more.
